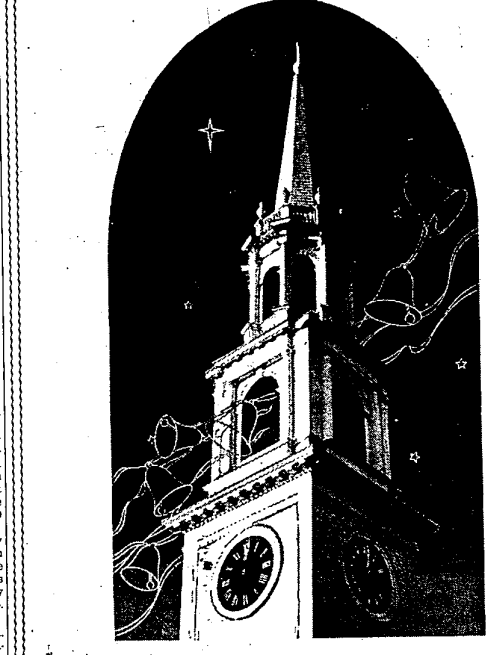
Misfortune Hits Hosners' Again.
