 two firms had submitted "informal quotations" previously to Tegles, and those quotations were discussed at the last public meeting when trustees voted to take bids.  
 After voting 5-0 to award the special cleanup job to Taulbee, Cairns moved that specifications be drawn and bids taken July 1 for a three-year contract for regular garbage pickup. Taulbee has

been the township's garbage contractor by informal agreement.  
 "The cleanup will be in the first week in May on this schedule:  
 Monday, May 1, from Eight Mile to 10 1/2 Mile; May 2, from 10 1/2 Mile to 12 Mile; May 3, Sections 4 and 9 which includes Kendallwood One, Colony Park, Rolling Oaks and Heritage Hills subdivisions; May 4, 12 Mile to 13 1/2 Mile Road; and May 5, from the top half of 13 Mile to 14 Mile and catch-ups in the remainder of the township.  
 Picked up will be such items as refrigerators, stoves, televisions, couches, building materials and brush.

In an official tribute to be recorded in the board minutes, Petz expressed "high praise" and "commendation in honor of Peter Forge." He added that "faith and hope was a vital part" of Forge's life, which would have totaled 50 years April 4.  
 A member of the De Molay who had also served in World War II, Forge "was genuine. His honor and dignity was part of the fabric that made his being," explained Petz, a long-time friend of Forge. "Our final homage is paid to Peter Forge as our friend."
