The Farmington Fire Department was called out twice Sunday evening to extinguish auto fires.

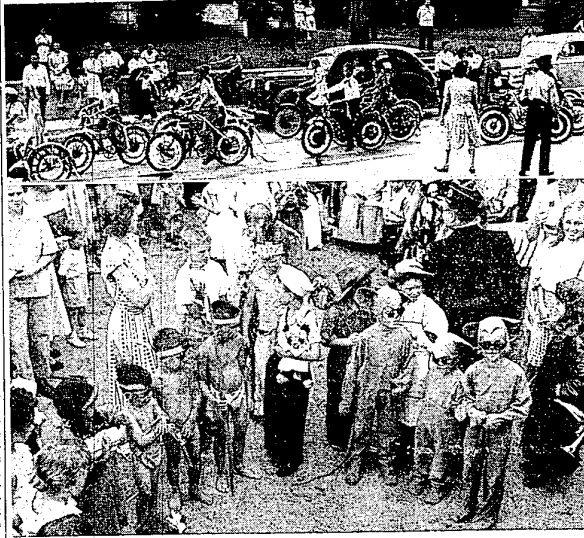
Mrs. Bernard Foster To Sing Solo Sunday
