Another attractive booth will be the fancy work booth which will be open from 2:00 and 6:00 p.m.

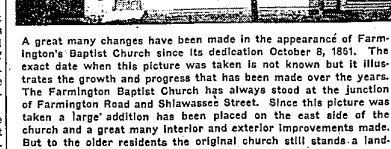
Safety Patrol To Attend Detroit Tigers Game

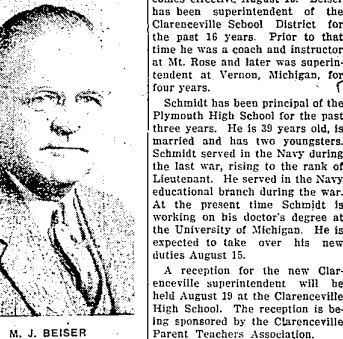
The youngsters are all students of Clarenceville and attend various schools throughout Farmington Township School District.
