JUST IN CASE... what is happening to the reflector signs along the side of the highway through these reflectors...

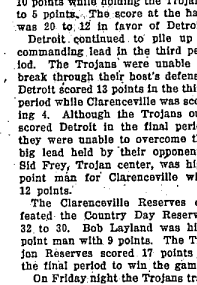
EVEN THE JONQUIL... and the crocus have been fooled, for we have heard reports of our early spring flowers sending forth shoots, and peeking through the ground.

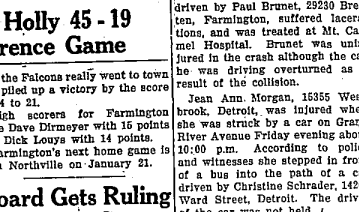
