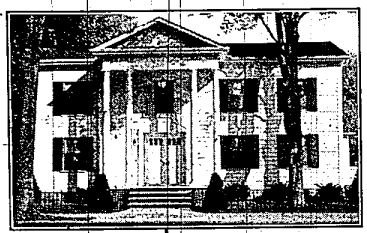

**Fire Fighting Cost To Receive Study**  
 The cost of fighting fires in 1950-54, more than half of which probably will be caused by careless smokers and brand smokers, is to be studied by forest fire officials of the federal government, Michigan and eight other midwestern states in Milwaukee.  
 Revising the areas needing protection and the expected costs for the next five years in Michigan will be outlined by Michigan conservation department forest fire chief Milton Bergman. Under the Clayton McNary law of 1924, the federal government makes available forest fire protection funds not exceeding in amount the funds appropriated by the states for this purpose.  
 Last year's total fire control appropriation was \$1,090,000,000, and during that time 775 fires were suppressed which burned 14,856 Michigan acres. Over 19,000 acres have been ravished by 1,220 fires so far this year. Neither total included acres burned on national forest land in the state.

**Claims Michigan Gas Tax Too Low**  
 "The nation's average car owner pays 25 per cent more state gasoline taxes and 33 per cent more over-all automobile taxes than the average Michigan motorist according to data recently published by the Public Roads Administration," said Harry P. Ward, President, Michigan Good Roads Federation.  
 "Total special state and federal taxes averaged \$11 per vehicle in 1948," said Ward, "and this includes heavy trucks which pay a comparatively higher fee.  
 On the average a Michigan car owner driving 10,000 miles per year pays \$19 in state gasoline taxes and about \$11 for registration (license plates). This goes for highways, roads and streets. On top of it the federal government collects also on gasoline, oil, accessories, and other items to the tune of about \$30. Yet, the Michigan motorist's total is 25 per cent under the national average," Ward continued.  
 The Good Roads chief contends, however, that Michigan car owners do not save anything by a lower gas tax rate.  
 "According to a 'Tax Economics Bulletin' published by the petroleum industry, the average 1948 price of regular gasoline, tax included, in 50 representative U. S. cities was 25.8 cents. Michigan motorists paid the same per gallon, but the average state gas tax, according to the same source, was 4.8 cents, while in Michigan it was only three cents.  
 "Others' nearly two cents per gallon more that Michigan motorists pay, not in taxes for much needed highways, but to maintain the high profit level of the oil companies which sell gasoline for less money in states where the tax per gallon is higher than in Michigan," said Ward.

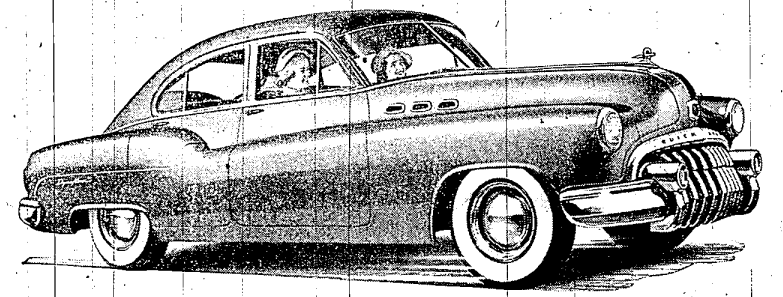

 leased to Erb & Marshall of Port Huron, makers of "Kenwood" winter garments. At present 25 women are employed; 50 women will be at work by January 1.  
 Sturgis - Six new industries furnish employment for 270 persons and \$2,150 weekly payroll: Gravo-Flow Company, plumbing equipment; Saniter Company, rest room equipment; Sturgis Clark Company, packing cartons; Sturgis Foundry Company, auto parts; Universal Diesel Company, Diesel engine parts, and M & R Dietetic Laboratories, Inc., processed milk foods. M & R is branch of Columbus, Ohio, concern. Others are independent.  
 Newberry - Atlas Plywood Company, employing 120; Flint River Fuel & Lumber Co., employing 40. Both are branch firms.  
 Bangor - Here is one of the top Michigan small towns in point of industrial progress. Listen to this:  
 Six new industries furnish employment for approximately 500 persons; 150 new homes built during the past 18 months. Municipally owned baseball, softball, football park rebuilt and lighted. Village debt free. Six new business buildings in past two years.  
 The firms: Standard Coil Products, radio parts manufacturer, branch of Chicago firm; D-J-Vel Metal products from Chicago in 1946 employs 80 men; Bangor Plastics, branch of Benton Harbor firm; Howard Engineering Co., from Otsego; Well-Made Garment Company, feeder branch of Chicago main factory.
