School Board Rejects Studying Extended Year For Local District

 Study of a year-around operation for the Farmington School District has been shelved by board trustees.
 In a 4 to 2 vote, trustees voted down a resolution by Aldo Vagnozzi, board vice president, to allow continued study of the plan.
 Voting against further study were Kenneth Perrin, board president, and Trustees Mervyn Ross, Kathryn Stirling, and Ronald Emmitt. Supporting were Vagnozzi and William Corliss. Trustee Elizabeth Brennan was absent.
 The termination came after a year-long study by a com-

mittee composed of teachers, parents, school administrators and a board trustee which recommended further study.
 The committee's recommendation was the "45-15" plan used in Northville, which calls for students to spend nine weeks in school four times a year, and receive three three-week vacations in between.
 There would also be a two-week shutdown in the summer for general maintenance on all school facilities.
 Disagreement arose over the phase two aspect, which calls for in-depth study by school administrators and a pilot program.
 Perrin advised holding of

the study.
 "To put a greater value into the study, a great deal of staff participation is needed. At this time the staff doesn't have the excess time to devote because of operational changes that are taking place and because many are new to their positions," said Perrin.
 Richard Pryor, committee chairman, says the committee has gone as far as it can as a lay body and now needs the assistance of professionals. He disputed the idea that administrators are too busy.
 "All we're really looking for is a principal. That's all we want. The board is making a mountain out of a molehill. We don't need the

superintendent on the committee to continue the study," said Pryor.
 Emmitt withheld his support saying he didn't see the need for the system in Farmington.
 "We have the preliminaries to put it into function when needed. I don't see the need for it at this time. Farmington is an extremely fluid community, and this system would cause problems for families who move from one district to another," he said.
 Corliss defended the continuation of the study saying it is essential in considering modernization of the educational system in Farmington schools.
 "We have needed today for

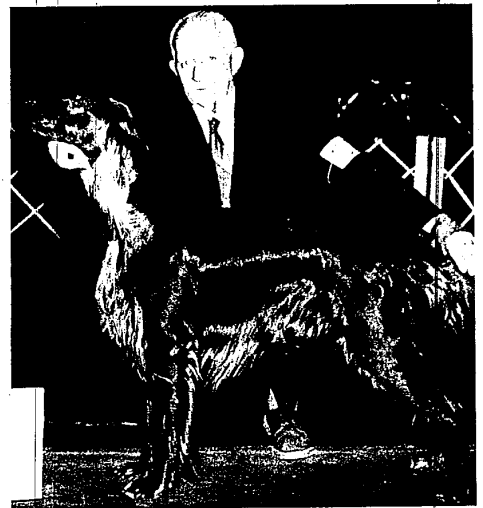
