WALTER GAERTNER ATTENDS LUTHERAN CONFERENCE

Walter Gaertner of Farmington represented the Missionary Board of the English district of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod at the General Missions Conference of the Lutheran Church at Kansas City, Missouri, May 13 to 15.

More than 150 mission leaders of the Missouri Synod from all parts of the United States gathered for a three-day meeting to study a program of mission evangelism for the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod in North America.

Dr. P. C. Streufert, secretary of missions for the church body, told the mission leaders in the opening sessions on Tuesday morning that 77,900 new members were added to the Synod in 1951, bringing the total membership to 1,870,000.

More than a thousand new mission stations were opened in the western hemisphere since the beginning of World War II, but almost 250 of the 5,000 Missouri Synod churches are without a pastor at the present time, Dr. Streufert reported.

A meeting was held at the home of the W. Allen Nelsons on Wednesday, May 14, to discuss local, state and national problems and individual privileges and responsibility in connection with government affairs.

U-M MAN TELLS HOW TO UTILIZE BASEMENT SPACE

Ingenuity and careful planning can give you an informal and quite complete "second home" in your basement, Herbert W. Johe, assistant professor of architecture at the University of Michigan, says.

If you plan to convert your basement into a supplementary area where the whole family can carry on various activities, you will need to consider such problems as treatment of floors, walls, ceiling, partitioning and furniture.

"There are two points of view in the matter of painting the ceiling and pipes, according to the professor. (1) 'You may use color in terms of accenting a material. For instance, you could,' he points out, 'treat all the wood — joists, bridging and underside of the floor above — in one color, maybe dark green or warm grey. Metal water pipes, heating ducts and soil lines might be painted in bright colors as accents.'

(2) 'Or, you can be conservative. Paint pipes and ceiling the same color, preferably a neutral value.

'Plaster board makes an excellent and inexpensive ceiling, but remember,' Professor Johe warns, 'don't use it to cover areas where there are water pipes, since pipes corrode from the inside and may give trouble by leaking in the near future. Pipes should be kept easily accessible to repairs.'
