Three State Institutions Show Enrollment Gains

Michigan's three largest educational institutions — University of Michigan, Michigan State College, and Wayne University — marked up enrollment gains, as indications of higher learning in the United States showed an increase of 2.2 per cent in full-time enrollments this fall.

In terms of full-time enrollment, the University of Michigan stands as the fourth largest college in the U. S., with an enrollment of 17,500; and Michigan State College is ninth with 12,936. No other Michigan colleges are listed among the top 25 schools in full-time enrollment.
