

Farmington Takes Championship!; Falcons, Trojans In Tourney Tonight

Van Dyke Bows In Game Friday By 57-47 Score

The Farmington Falcons won undisputed title to the Inter-Lakes Conference championship Friday by defeating Van Dyke 57-47.

In the first quarter Van Dyke outscored the Falcons by jumping off to a 14-4 lead. Winters led Van Dyke with five points. McCoy scored four, Phillips three, and Gordon one. McCaffrey scored Farmington's only field goal in the quarter, while Dryden and Brewaker each canned a free throw.

In the second quarter, the Falcons outscored Van Dyke 22-10, to take the lead for the first time at the half, 26-24.

McCaffrey's tip-in at McMontier's missed free throw with four seconds to go in the half gave the Falcons the lead, which they never relinquished. McCaffrey and Fawcett led the Falcon scoring in the period with seven apiece. Donahue scored two, and McMontier and Brewaker each canned a charity toss. McCoy paced Van Dyke with seven points and Gordon scored the other two.

In the last quarter, Coach Burch substituted freely, but the best Van Dyke could do was to outscore the Falcons 13-13. McCaffrey led the Farmington scoring with six. Fawcett followed with four. 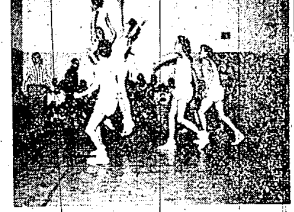

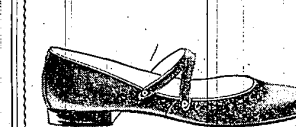

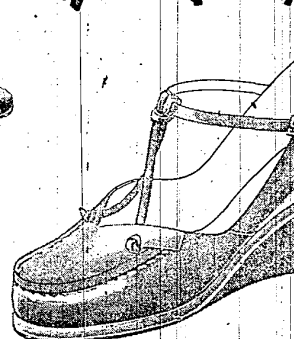
