

Dennis Cooper To Show, Narrate Michigan Film November 19

Dennis Glen Cooper, explorer, travel photographer, and television celebrity, will show his own exclusive color motion pictures and speak on the topic "Pouring Glorious Michigan" at 8:15 p.m. next Saturday, November 19, at the Farmington Junior High School auditorium. Cooper appears under the auspices of the Farmington Kiwanis Club Travel and Adventure Series.

The new Michigan color motion pictures represent a score of expeditions by boat, plane and motor car. The films, which required many summers to make, cover many principal tourist haunts. They show Michigan's famous lakes, forests, waterfalls, and world-famed recreational areas in the Upper and Lower Peninsulas. Among the highlights are scenes in and around Detroit; a canoe trip on the Au Sable River, many lovely waterfalls of the north country; a visit to primitive Isle Royale; a stay at magnificent Blaney Park Resort and at world famous Mackinac Island; and a ride in a "Dunescooter" over the enormous white sand dunes north of Muskegon. Cooper, a master of platform technique, accompanies the picture throughout with rapid-fire narrative.

Professionally, Cooper is head of the Exact Science Department of Sherrard Intermediate School in Detroit. He is a recognized authority in his field, and has written and lectured widely on scientific and educational subjects. Cooper's love of color photography has carried him far and wide every summer for many years. His superb travelogues, all done in original color film, cover national parks and recreational areas all the way from California and Arizona to Florida. Michigan is his favorite stamping ground, however, and his films of this foremost vacation state, and of Isle Royale, have been presented before many of the nation's leading audiences.

Cooper's explorations and scientific writings on the prehistoric color diggings of Isle Royale won him active membership in New York's famous Explorers' Club, to which more than 90% of the world's greatest explorers belong. He also is a member of numerous other scientific and educational organizations.

Last year, through its International Relations Office, the American Red Cross rushed aid to 11 foreign countries which suffered great devastation from flood, hurricane, or fire.
