

Rhubarb, often called pie plant because it is used so frequently in pies, is very perishable and the flavor is easily lost if not properly cared for. If it must be kept a few days before it is to be used, cut off leaves, wash the stalks and dry them thoroughly. Wrap them in wax paper or place them in moisture and vapor proof containers and store them in the refrigerator.
