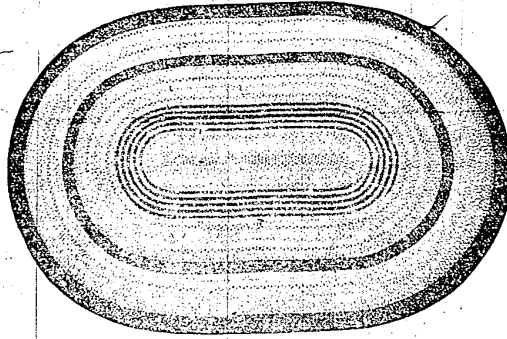

that 192 new home permits were issued in the first quarter of this year while only 69 were issued during the same period in 1955. Much of the increased activity has come from the Kendallwood and Westbrook Manor Subdivisions in the north central section of the Township.
Because of the limited amount of land available, home construction in the City is continuing to drop slightly. During the first quarter of this year, 22 new permits were issued as compared to 39 during the same period last year.

also recommended rejection of a proposal to amend the Zoning Ordinance to provide for the location of homes for the aged in residential zones. The request for the amendment was made in order to clear the way for the construction of the Detroit Baptist Manor on Thirteen Mile Road across from Glen Oaks Country Club. The majority of the citizens present at the meeting voiced approval of the plan. There was some objection, however.

Members of the Board stated that approval of the plan would open the door for such homes in any residential section of the Township. They added that this type of blanket authorization could create many problems in the future.

will bring worshippers closer to the service. The initial church work will seat 200 people, with no altar. The building has been designed for rapid expansion to a seating capacity of 400. The roof of the transept and also the entrance hall are of cast, so placed as to focus light and attention on the central altar, and a large redwood screen of birch stepping from the floor to the high peak.
Services will be held at 10 a.m. every Sunday throughout the summer and the fall. A new schedule will be announced. A formal Dedication Service will be held in October with the Rt. Reverend Bishop Enrich, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan, officiating.

Post Office To Get New Mail Trucks

Four government mail trucks of the latest design are expected to be delivered to the Farmington Post Office the latter part of this week to handle distribution of mail in this postal district. Postmaster Henry Trombley revealed Tuesday.
Featuring right hand drive and automatic transmissions, the new trucks should start on route deliveries by the first of next week. Postmaster Trombley said. Routes for the four new trucks have not yet been selected.
The new trucks will replace private vehicles which, up to now, have been used on routes. These vehicles, owned by individual mail carriers, have been used for postal deliveries on a contract basis with the postal department.
At the present time there are 12 mail routes in the Farmington Postal District. Postmaster Trombley indicated that the local district hopes eventually to obtain mail trucks for all the routes and any other routes that may be added in the interim.

SOCIAL AGENCY OPENS DISTRIBUTION CENTER IN AREA

Authorization has been granted by the Township Board to the Oakland County Social Welfare Agency for the use of the No. 3 Fire Station on the fourth Tuesday of each month as a distribution point for surplus foods.
The No. 3 Fire Station is located on Wheeler Street just north of Grand River in the Clarencerville area. Surplus foods will be distributed to qualified persons from 8:30 a.m. to 12 noon every fourth Tuesday of each month. The distribution is made to persons who are receiving social aid, state old age pensions, unemployment compensation or social security. Persons in the Farmington area are requested to make application at the Oakland County Social Welfare office, Pontiac.
Officials stated that a total of 40 tons of surplus foods were distributed in Oakland County during April. Items included on the list are cream, butter, pasteurized cheddar cheese, non-fat dry milk, shortening, beans, rice, enriched white flour and canned pork and gravy.
