CITY ZONING BOARD TO HOLD HEARING ON NOVEMBER 27

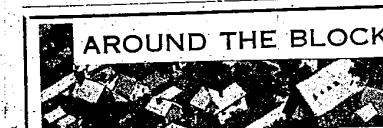
