# To Speak On Alcoholism - At 1st Methodist Feb. 17

Dr. Green is manager and medical head of the Brighton Hospital at Brighton, Michigan. His subject will be "Alcoholism."

Dr. Green has had much personal experience with the effects of alcohol in his profession as a medical doctor. He has administered medical treatment and has interviewed and lectured on the subject of alcoholism to hundreds of individuals, as well as many groups of people.
