Harold R. Coats, a former Michigan pastor, secretary of the Missouri Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, is heading the churches relief operations in the area in cooperation with the Red Cross.

Elder Wayne Hyde pointed out that these months ago the Clarenceville Adventist Church contributed to a special disaster offering sponsored by the international headquarters of the church at Washington D. C. and that an appropriation from this fund is being made available to help rehabilitate tornado victims.

Mrs. Fern Griffin head of the local Red Cross Welfare Society, reports that the unit has on hand ample stocks of clothing to help with any local or state emergency. The mobile disaster van of the Michigan Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, has been packed with clothing, bedding and other supplies since the beginning of the tornado season and is ready for emergency use.

Another disaster and famine relief offering was taken up May 25 which will also help in other such cases.
