School Bus Driver Training Planned

Training programs for new school bus drivers and an advanced course for experienced drivers are to be introduced into Southern Michigan schools this fall through the field services division of Western Michigan University, Kalamazoo and Eastern Michigan College, Ypsilanti.

A special training program had been arranged through the county superintendent's offices so that schools hiring new bus drivers can be assured of entering these people in the Michigan School Bus Driver Education Program before October 31.

The new program for experienced drivers will follow. Administrators desiring to send new drivers to the first program are being asked to contact their county superintendent or the bus driver education instructor at Eastern Michigan College, Ypsilanti, or Western Michigan University, Kalamazoo.

Date for the primary program in Oakland County is September 9. Four sessions are planned for each group.

Aqua Follies Run August 20-31

Olympic diving champion Patricia McCormick, who will headline the Aqua Follies, Al Sheehan's famed aquatic-and-stage show Aug. 20-31 in Detroit, is distinguished as the greatest woman diver of all time.

The 27-year-old Lakewood, California brunette, who turned professional to star in this eighteenth edition of the Aqua Follies, achieved an Olympic Games "double-double" as her feat is termed.

Both at Helsinki in 1952 and again at Melbourne last December, Miss McCormick captured both the springboard and the high tower diving titles. No other man or woman has ever won both Olympic diving medals two times in a row.

Other nationally known swimming and diving stars and a constellation of prominent stage acts make this year's Aqua Follies the most spectacular we have ever staged," producer Sheehan commented. Miss McCormick is the first diver ever to win every Senior National AAU Indoor and Outdoor championship in one year. She first performed this sweep in 1951 and repeated in 1954.

Recently she was presented the Sullivan award, highest and most sought after amateur sports award in the nation.

Since 1949, she has held 33 major titles, including three Pan-American Games and 27 national championships.

There will be 12 nightly performances of the Aqua Follies, starting August 20. Tickets are on sale in advance at the Aqua Follies Ticket Office at Grinnell's, 1515 Woodward, Detroit.
