Lawn Discoloration Common At This Time

Many lawns are now beginning to show a brownish discoloration which appears to be widespread over the entire lawn.
 If you have a bluegrass lawn which you have been cutting at a height of less than 1 1/2 inches, this condition is more likely to occur, authorities say. During periods of hot, dry weather, bluegrass goes into semi-dormant condition, which is greatly accentuated in very dry weather, although it will readily recover as the temperature becomes lower and moisture level in the soil is raised.
 The Wayne County Cooperative Extension Service suggests that you not fertilize during these periods and that you not cut unless absolutely necessary. Maintain adequate water by watering to a depth of 6 inches in the soil once a week.




