

### Safecrackers Get \$200 in Livonia

Safecrackers broke into the W. Seven Mile Road, Livonia, Spiegel Catalog Center, 28225, pried off the front plate, shattered the fireproof composition and then opened the safe door, taking \$200 in cash and an unknown amount in change, according to a report to Livonia Police by Manager Naomi Donahoo.

Miss Donahoo discovered the theft when she opened the Center in the morning and found desk drawers open with contents scattered around the rooms and noticed the safe in the middle of the Center. She told officers the thieves also took four adding machines valued at more than \$340.

## Teachers Compile Data On Job Opportunities

Suburban teachers concerned about the problems of school dropouts and achieving realistic vocational training for students in urban employment-bound areas, interviewed scores of men and women who hire young people for jobs in Livonia, Plymouth, Redford, Farmington, and other northwestern metropolitan area communities.

A recent article in the Observer, which stressed the growing job opportunities for youth with training in such service occupations as deliverymen, nurses, food handlers, and related jobs, drew a great deal of attention and raised additional questions regarding the current drop-out rate in the United States.

**STUDY YOUTH NEEDS**  
Trustees of the Livonia Board of Education and other school board members in the Schoolcraft College area recently reviewed and published a study of the curriculum needs of youth who did not plan to go to school beyond the high school level.

Listed too, with the help of Livonia School Board and Schoolcraft College researchers, were selected occupations offering greater job opportunities for suburban youths. These were:

Assistant Superintendent of Livonia Schools, Dr. Paul E. Johnson, who was chairman of the Schoolcraft College advisory committee, which compiled the occupations having the greatest potential for suburban youth, praised the Workshop committee for helping to sharpen the identification of and the location of occupations for youth. "A greater awareness of all the job opportunities for youth,"

people helps teachers teach," Johnson said. "We in Livonia are proud of the high school, vocational and the existing school courses we already offer employment-bound youth. We can anticipate still other purposeful programs of this nature as our Livonia secondary school curriculum meshes into the meaningful courses Schoolcraft College will offer our suburban young men and women this fall."

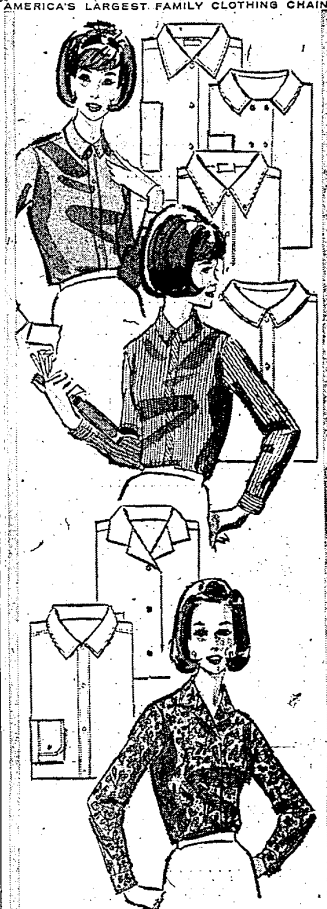
