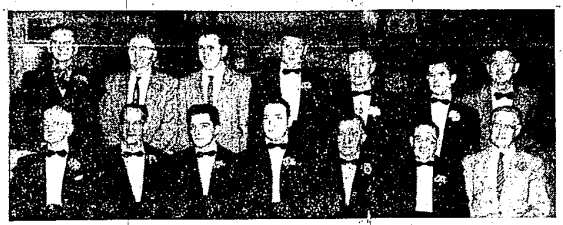

**Falcons Falter In Last Period; Lose to Lakers**

After leading throughout the first three quarters of play, the Falcons faltered badly in the final period last Friday night to suffer a 48-40 upset at the hands of Walled Lake.

This was underdog Walled Lake's first league win of the season. The victory pulled them into a fourth place tie with Farmington in the league. Berkeley now leads in the Troy-Lakes League with a record of 5-0, followed by Southfield, 4-1 and Van Dyke, 3-2.

By the end of the first quarter the Falcons held a 26-22 lead and they held this four-point margin throughout the second quarter, to leave the floor at half-time leading 36-32. Again in the third quarter the Falcons were in command. In the final period, however, they fell badly. The Walled Lake squad won on a scoring spree to dump in 16 points while holding the Falcons to a mere four points.

Frank Fink led the Walled Lake club to victory by racking up 15 points. He was followed by Bob Smith with 12. Al Leslie took top scoring honors for Farmington with 13 points.

This Friday the Falcons will take on Waterford in a game at Waterford.
