Big Jehovah International Meet Planned

Jehovah's Witnesses from the Farmington congregation today announced plans are under way to attend an international convention of Jehovah's Witnesses in New York city this summer.

Ernest Szalma, presiding minister of the local group, said the convention could well be the largest in the history of Jehovah's Witnesses. It is scheduled for July 27 through August 1 and will be held in Yankee Stadium and the Polo Grounds simultaneously.

The last international convention, attended by many Witnesses from Farmington, was held in 1953 in Yankee Stadium and reached a peak attendance of 165,000, including the overflow of thousands of people from other parts of the world.

Mr. Szalma said, have arranged this year for the program to be held in both places, with most program features repeated at the Polo Grounds immediately following the first presentation in Yankee Stadium.

The Watchtower Bible and Tract Society, governing agency for Jehovah's Witnesses, has been making special travel arrangements for foreign delegates. Many missionaries who have served in other lands will also be brought to the United States for the Bible convention. Purpose of the gathering is to provide stimulus for the New World society of Jehovah's Witnesses in Christian association, Bible instruction and ministerial training. This, Mr. Szalma said, is in accordance with provisions made for God's people in Bible days.

Mr. Szalma stated that it is not yet known how many Witnesses from the area will attend, but, he added, special travel arrangements are being made by train. He said further it may be necessary to make limited meeting arrangements or cancel local meetings altogether during convention time.

Franklin Church Merwin Named Board Chairman

In the organization of the Board of Trustees of Franklin Community Church for the new fiscal year of the church, Charles Merwin was named chairman of the board of trustees. He will be assisted by James Crawford, who is to be the vice-chairman, with Arthur Hays remaining as secretary of the board and Mr. A. Newton Cole as treasurer.

Stepping down as chairman of the board is Robert Yingling who also has resigned membership of the board because of a move in residence in connection with his business.

The Minister has authorized the board to obtain a list of names of suggestions for placement of Mr. Yingling to keep the board at full membership.

Other members of the Board of Trustees include Harry F. Barr, who is also secretary of the building committee, Grant L. Silver, who is chairman of the building committee, W. Calvin Patterson and Robert J. Swift, new members of the board.

The building committee and the board of trustees work together very closely on all building matters and are now working jointly on plans for a new educational and social wing for the church and a potential long-range plan for obtaining a new parsonage for the Church.
