Disagree on Minimum Lot Size To Be Allowed in Village

Efforts by the Wood Creek Farms Village Council to have the minimum lot sizes in the village's proposed zoning ordinance reduced to the major topic discussed at the regular council meeting Tuesday night. Councilman Zar Reader reported that he had met with the planning commission on the matter and that they had agreed to a minimum lot size of 45,000 square feet in Zone 1 and a minimum of 35,000 square feet in Zone 2. There is disagreement, however, on what the minimum should be for a small portion of land in the southwest corner of the village designated as Zone 3. Originally, a minimum lot size of 20,000 feet had been called for.
