

Community College Weighed by Schools

Clarensville school district will probably join four other northwest Wayne county districts soon to build and operate a community college. Committees now are working on the project several months on. The other four districts include Plymouth, Livonia, South Redford and Redford Union.

RESIDENTS of the five-school area hope that in five or six years their students will not have to pay an average of \$1,500 a year to "go away" to college. Each district has contributed a share to a \$3,000 fund for a community college.

A COMMITTEE headed by Lonnie Brashear, attorney and former member of the Livonia school board, is working on a rough plan for an amendment to the state school law permitting different school districts to form a separate over-all district to administer a community college.

There are 40,832 in the five districts, according to a recent census.

CLARENSVILLE, in both Livonia and Redford townships, has 2,770 students; Plymouth, which includes all of the City of Plymouth, Plymouth township and parts of Northville and Canton townships, has 5,361.

Redford Union, in the north part of Redford township, has 2,000 students; Livonia, which includes all of the City of Livonia and part of Nankin township, has 13,932.

TOTAL ASSESSED valuation of the entire area is \$530 million—more than enough to support a community college.

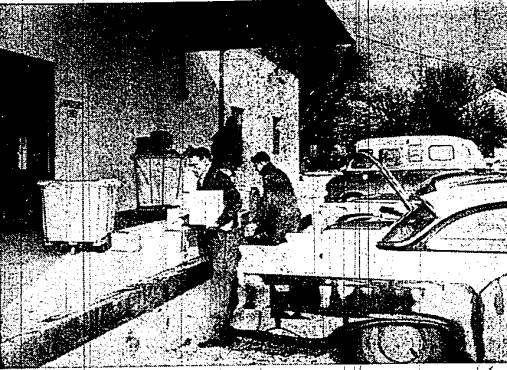

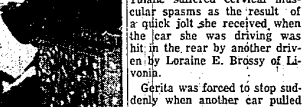
