**Last Match Pin Clinches  
Wrestling Win for Falcons**

Farmington's wrestling team eked out a close 26-24 decision over Livonia Bentley last Thursday evening at the Falcon gymnasium. The match was witnessed by one of the largest and most enthusiastic crowds in Farmington's three years of varsity wrestling.

Going into the twelfth and final match the Falcons trailed 24-21. A loss meant a team loss for Farmington, a decision meant a 24-24 tie and a pin would win the meet.

The Falcons jumped out to an early 16-0 lead as they defeated their first four opponents. The early Farmington lead was featured by one of the highest scoring bouts most observers have seen in high school wrestling.

This was in the 103 pound class in which Charlie Rogers of Farmington outpointed Paul Felice 17-0. Repeated reversals and escapes by Rogers helped run up his high point total.

The first fall of the evening was racked up by 120 pounder Tom Peckham in the fourth bout as he pinned Dennis Hisayasu in 1:30.

In the fifth bout the Bulldogs went to work on their 16-0 deficit and won six consecutive matches to jump into a 24-16 lead. Three of the six wins were on pins.

In the eleventh match, Dan Trojans Post 49-43 Win Over Milford

The Clarenceville Trojan team took an early lead in action against Milford Friday night. The match was a 49-43 victory.

This gives the Trojans a 1-1 record in Wayne - Oakland League competition as the cases conclude activities until after the Christmas holidays.

They will swing back into action on Thursday, January 7, when they meet Schaefer High of Wyandotte in a non-league encounter.

At the end of the first quarter the Trojans were out front 12-8 and maintained their narrow margin lead throughout the second quarter to leave the floor at half-time with the score reading 24-21 in their favor.

The Trojan JV's also continue their winning ways by posting an easy win over Milford. After losing their opener to Farmington, the Clarenceville JV's posted three consecutive victories.
