Southfield Community Church Plans Commissioning Service

Mr. and Mrs. Don Douglas (nee Gwen Nichols) will be commissioned for missionary service by the Southfield Community Church, 21122 Indian between Farmington and Five Mile Roads, on May 7, at 7 p.m. The commissioning service will be conducted jointly by the church and the Far Eastern Gospel Crusade, the Mission Board of the Philippine Episcopal Conference. Mr. Douglas will serve. They will leave Southfield for the west coast shortly after the service and will sail from San Francisco on May 7 for the Philippines. BOTH MR. AND MRS. DOUGLAS were raised in the Southfield Community Church under the missionary emphasis ministry of Pastor Bayne, and both dedicated their lives there for missionary service. They took their training at Detroit Bible Institute and Mr. Douglas continued his training at Wayne State University. They have been on deputation work for the last year, raising funds for their support in the Philippines. Their first assignment there will be language school. The home church is assuming approximately one-fourth of their support. The service will include a message by Rev. Philip Armstrong, founder and Executive Secretary of the Far Eastern Gospel Crusade, president of a Commissioning Certificate, a charge to the candidates by Pastor Bayne, and a dedicatory prayer by the elders of the church. Mr. and Mrs. Douglas are the fifth couple to go out from the church in Christian service. Several others are in various stages of preparation. A reception for the Douglases will be held after the commissioning service by the Missionary Society and friends.

Pope To Bless TV Audience

A TV tour of the Vatican will give work to the WXYZ Channel 7, from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. Easter Sunday. The program will be in color. The April 11 telecast, under supervision of ABC Executive Producer John H. Secondari, with Helen Jean Rogers as producer and Nicholas Winter as director. "Our favorite sequence," Secondari said, "is Pope John at work at his desk, giving a special blessing and a message about the church's mission and world peace. 'You stand in St. Peter's Square and look up as the figure of Pope John steps to the window at being his Sunday greeting, the Angelus and benediction to the crowd.' 'You walk into the Pope's private library and stand beside him as he works at his desk. It is here in this troubled world religion fills the need which read alone leaves vacant.' ANOTHER NOTABLE sequence shows the pope sitting in an ancient Ethiopian rite with chafts clattered by tom-toms and hand clappers like maracas. The TV audience is shown a Swiss guard getting his armor, 4,200 purple-robed bishops streaming out of the basilica after a work session, the famed Pietà which is brought to this country, as well as fresco by the same Michelangelo; the white-robed nuns of St. Francis restoring ancient tapestries, and the choir of the Sistine choir practicing the Gloria; then singing it in a ceremony with Pope John.
