## Falcon Cindermen Win 3rd Dual Track Meet

Falcon cindermen once again came out on top as they won their third dual meet, beating Southfield 14-9.

As was expected, Southfield took an early lead and finished with a score of 27 points to Farmington's 9 at the end of the field events. Swept in both 100 and 200 yard sprints, the Falcons then took the first two places in the broad jump, Ron Smedley leaping 19' 10", Ron Cleveland coming in second with 17' 10".

The first two pole vault places were then taken by Southfield both at 11 feet; Mark Williams captured third with a vault of 10 feet. The score: 27-9.

Running events showed the Falcon center strength as the 880 relay team of Russ Robinson, Ron Cleveland, Bob Negoshian, and Gary Lockwood won at the Blue Jay four by a solid five seconds with a time of 1:58.

Farmington then swept the One Mile Run with John Karwoski, Joe Watson, and Ron McGraw placing.

Ton Smedley dominated the 320 yard high hurdles as he swept into first place in the event with a 1:57 time; Bob Lorenz brought a third in the event.

The Falcon speed team of Dennis Hunt and John Lockwood then brought in the first two places in the 880, with Dennis' winning time at 2:02.

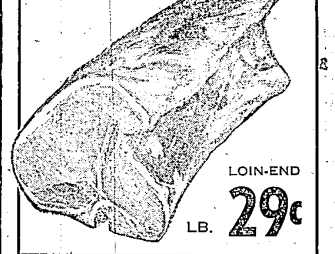
