## Farmington Legion Team Wins In Opening Day Doubleheader

Farmington's Groves-Walker Post 345 Junior American Legion Baseball Team opened its season on Sunday, June 14, with two decisive victories over Southfield by the scores of 8-4 and 4-1.

The opening day pitchers sent out by manager Wally Christiansen turned in fine performances for Farmington, both are rookies with the Groves-Walker Post team.

STEVE PAGE struck out 14 batters, the first seven in a row, in posting his victory over Southfield in the opener. Miles Kearney fanned ten batters and gave up only one run on five hits in posting his win in the nightcap.

Farmington's Dick Johnston slammed out a bases-loaded double in the first inning of the opener to stake Page to a 2-run lead. John Kraft had walked, Jim Stevenson was safe on a fielder's choice and Bill Freeman walked to load the bases for Johnston's two-bagger.

Farmington increased their lead in the third inning on a walk to Jim Acitelli, who stole second and advanced to third on a wild pitch. Rick Goyt got a base on balls and also stole second. Both Acitelli and Goyt scored on Kraft's sharp single to center field. Kraft earned out respect as coach of their respective American Legion baseball teams.

The Groves-Walker Post team plays host to Milford tomorrow night (Friday, June 19) on the Our Lady of Sorrows baseball diamond, Ten Mile Road at Power. Farmington travels to Berkley Saturday night, June 20, and again on Sunday, June 21.

Tomorrow night's game at OLS is slated to get under way at 8 p.m.

A two-run-homer by Southfield's Bob Beard in the sixth and a two-out singles with men on first and second in the last frame gave Southfield their final three tallies.

In the second game of the Sunday doubleheader, Farmington took a 2-0 lead in the third inning on a two-out triple by Bill Freeman with Kraft and Stevenson aboard.

JIM ACITELLI hit a triple to score Brian Bender in the fourth inning and came home on a wild pitch to add two more runs for Farmington.

Farmington's four runs held up as alert fielding and a double play turned in by Lee Martilla, Kraft and Kearney nipped Southfield bids to challenge the lead.

An interesting sidelight to the game was the bringing together of two coaches, Dick Tyler of Farmington and Bud Bryant of Southfield, after three years. Tyler had coached the Farmington High School team to the Inter-Lakes Conference Championship three years ago and Bryant's Southfield High School team was one of the league rivals he faced en route to the title. Now both men are facing one another again as coaches of their respective American Legion baseball teams.

### Five Are Named To All-County Baseball Team

Five Farmington baseball players received honors this week as the All-County High School Baseball selections were announced.

North Farmington High School's outstanding infielder Jim Acitelli and Farmington High School's fine junior catcher Rick Johnston were both named to the All-County second team.

Three of Steve Brant's Falcones were given Honor-Mention in the All-County balloting this year. The Honor-Mention players were first baseman Jim Stephenson, outfielder Bill Freeman and pitcher Steve Page.

All of the Farmington All-County stars are currently doing service on Farmington's American Legion Junior Baseball team which swept a doubleheader from the Southfield Legion team on Sunday to open their season.

## Name Rick Goyt To Catholic 9 All-City Team

Rick Goyt, an outfielder and pitcher with the Our Lady of Sorrows High School baseball team this past season, has been named to the All-City Catholic Baseball Team.

Goyt led all other batsmen on the Catholic high school "dream team" with an average of .541. He hit four triples, 10 doubles and 13 singles during trips to the plate for the Lancer diamondmen this spring.

THE LANCER SPAR was also noted for his brilliant fielding. In one play from center-field, after making an over-the-shoulder catch of a fly ball Goyt threw a strike to home plate, 290 feet away, nipping a runner attempting to score from third after the catch.

Lancer baseball coach Bill Gallagher called on Goyt as a pitcher after a pitcher Tom Cunillo turned up with an injury. Goyt achieved a 4 and 1 pitching record for the Lancers, fanning 46 of the batters who faced him. The Lancers ended the season at 500, with six wins and six losses.

Goyt, a senior at OLS, also performed as a wingback on the Lancer football team which was unbeaten in 1963 and starred as a guard on the basketball team. He is presently on the Farmington American Legion Junior Baseball Team where he is playing his third year at short stop.
