### Discuss Issues In Senate Race

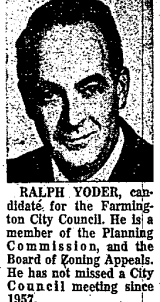

### Boy of 17 Killed In Accident

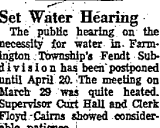
Seventeen-year-old Thomas A. Clay, 04, of 20764 Sunnydale, in Farmington, was buried today.
