

# Burial of A Time Capsule To Feature Farmington's Founders' Day Festival

Ed Carey, president of the Detroit Common Council, will greet visiting descendants from Farmington, N.Y., of the founders of Farmington, Mich., Thursday, July 29.

At 9:30 a.m. a horse-drawn buggy carrying the distinguished eastern visitors, will proceed from Detroit's Staller Hillon Hotel via Woodbury Avenue to the steps of the City County Building to be welcomed by Carey.

From there, the entourage goes to the Botford Inn, Farmington, for an honoring luncheon.

Festivities are planned for five days, beginning Tuesday, July 27.

On Saturday, July 31, at 11:30 a.m. Allison Green, auditor general of Michigan, will represent Governor George Romney at cornerstone laying ceremonies at Farmington City Hall commemorating Farmington as the first Quaker settlement in Michigan.

Also in the parade and at the ceremonies will be DeLoe Hamlin, chairman of Oakland County Board of Supervisors; Ray Baker, state representative; Billie Farm, Congressman; and mayors of surrounding cities.

One of the highlights of the ceremonies at the city hall will be the burying of a time capsule on the site where the historical marker designating Farmington as the "first Quaker Settlement in Michigan" will be erected.

The capsule, not to be opened until the 100th anniversary of this festival, will contain items of interest to other descendants to come.
