Farmington Dominates All-League Cage Team

The highly flying Farmington basketball team has topped the Inter-Lakes Conference playoffs once again, as three Falcons were named to the annual all-league team.

Mike Wilson, selected on the first team in the 1964-65 elections, heads the list for Farmington. He, in return, is accompanied by two juniors who will be back next year, center Mike Ames and forward Greg Dorow.

Wilson, one of the outstanding players last year in conference play, has sparked in the 1965-66 season, averaging about 17 points in each of the six league games. Greg Dorow, playing opposite Wilson for most of the games at the other guard spot, showed indications that he may be the key to Farmington's continued success next year.

The Clareneville High School wrestling team was scheduled to close out their 1965-66 dual meet season last night (February 22) at South Lyon. The Trojan matmen, under CHS' grid mentor Ralph Temby, won their 11th straight victory. The season's start of 124 would be the finest record turned in by a Trojan athletic team in recent years.

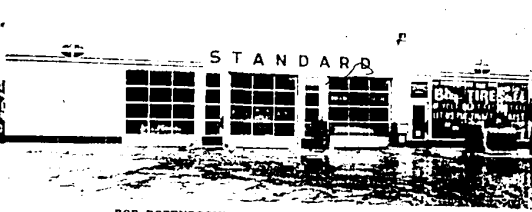
FATAC Meeting Slated March 3 For Moms & Dads

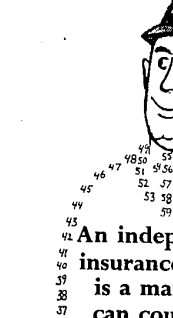
