Two Scholarships Awarded

Wednesday, May 18. Mr. John Mueller, Scholarship Chairman, presented the two deserving students each with \$150 checks. Both scholars will later receive an additional

\$150 to complete the scholarship. Valerie indicated she would attend Oakland University in the Fall and intends to major in English and Psychology, while Kurt said he would attend the University of Michigan and pursue studies in Mathematics and Science.

IN ADDITION TO the above project, Mrs. Leroy LeGros, President of the Council outlined the function of the Council was to strengthen local PTA units, develop leaders, sponsor community projects, help improve the school system, help organize new units and act as a liaison between the State and National Congress and the local PTA units.

Mrs. LeGros further reported that a PTA Leadership Training Course was presently under way through the joint sponsorship of the Farmington Area Council, the Michigan Congress of Parents and Teachers and Wayne State University. Stevenson, Vice-president; Mrs. Edward Comstock, Recording Secretary; Mrs. Robert Loomis, Corresponding Secretary; and Mrs. Paul Rankin, Treasurer. Mr. Harrison also brought the Council up to date on the annual school election to be held this coming June 13.
