

# Coy Runs For Re-Election

FARMINGTON Roads are "the crisis situation in this county" according to Law Coy, running in the new 24th district for county commissioner.

Coy is now in office in the old 27th district. A Wixom resident, he is seeking re-election in the new district that includes most of northwest Farmington Township, including Quakerstown, and stretches west to include much of Novi and the Wixom area. He is running against Democrat William O'Brien.

Coy, a retired captain in the Detroit Fire Department, is chairman of the county health commission and member of the personnel, legislative and health committees of the board of commissioners. A graduate of OCC and the Wayne State Mortuary School.

resolution to transfer \$500,000 out of the county general fund to give to the road commission, which made Oakland the only county in the state to finance roads out of the general fund budget.

The money allowed the county to get matching state and federal funds totaling \$1 million, according to Coy.

He has also supported efforts to change the gasoline and weight tax formula to increase Oakland's share.

But he opposes Gov. Milliken's proposed two cent increase in the gas tax to finance roads because of the half-cent which would go to mass transit.

He argues a half-mill in property tax could raise more money for roads and cost the average homeowner less. A similar proposal was defeated in Oakland County at the polls.

He is opposed to "autonomous" departments, which he feels aren't responsive to the people. "If I am going to take the blame, then I am going to want control", he said.

Coy opposed the proposed expansion of the county hospital, saying "within three quarters of a mile we have empty beds in state institutions that would do the same thing."

Extended nursing care for post-hospital care is one medical function that should be supported by the county, he feels.
