

# Northwestern Freeway Plans Are Announced

In an attempt to counter the ever-increasing traffic congestion in Oakland County, the Michigan Department of State Highways has initiated a building program for Northwestern Highway to be completed in 1976.

Paul Terrian, Southfield's public services engineer, says the city will contribute more than \$400,000 to the project, which will widen the existing Northwestern right-of-way from Telegraph Rd. to Orchard Lake Rd. from 204 feet to 318 feet.

ALTHOUGH Southfield is sharing in the funding of the construction from Telegraph to Orchard Lake, the entire construction program will extend to Oakley Park, near Haggerty Rd. in Commerce Township, passing through Franklin, West Bloomfield, Commerce Township, South-

field, Franklin and Wood Creek Farms.

Beginning in 1974, service drives will be constructed along the sides of Northwestern from Telegraph to Orchard Lake and be used to divert traffic while the main highway is converted to a six-lane depressed freeway.

There will be no service drives constructed from Orchard Lake to Oakley Park.

TWO-WAY interchanges will be provided at 12 Mile, Orchard Lake, 15 Mile and at the proposed M-275 at Oakley Park.

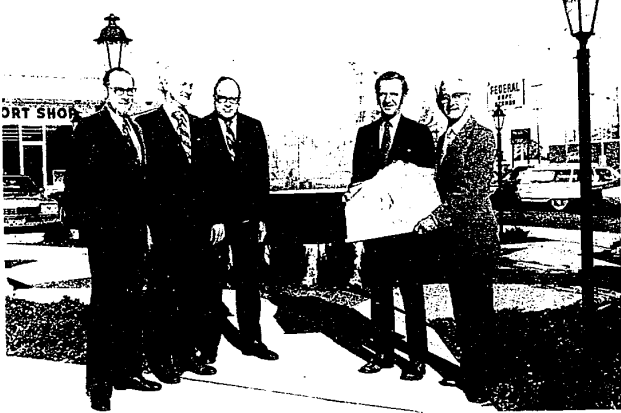
Interchanges at 13 Mile and Middle Belt will be partial,

allowing for northwest traffic exit and southeast traffic entrance on 13 Mile, while Middle Belt will provide for the reverse situation.

The Michigan Department of Highways has authorized land appraisals from Telegraph northwest to Drake in Bloomfield Township.

There also has been authorization for the purchase of land and relocation of businesses from Telegraph to Shrewsbury in Farmington Township.

More than 282 parcels of property, including 39 homes and 51 businesses, will be involved in the land acquisition, authorities said.

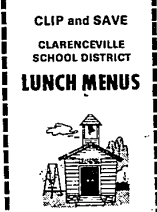
