

Westbrook Area Paving Gets OK From Residents

Last winter's bad weather which tore up Robinson St. and forced the closing of Westbrook School has turned out to be a boon for residents in the neighborhood of the school.

Robinson from Eight Mile to Salvador, Salvador from Robinson to Osmus and Osmus from Salvador to 503 feet north of Salvador, will be paved, with abutting property owners paying just one-third of the total cost.

Concerned about the closing of Westbrook, Clarenceville School District is the motivating force behind the paving project.

The district will pay one-third of the cost, Farmington Township the last third.

At a public hearing on the issue Monday night, Township Supervisor Curtis Hall called it, "such a bargain for the people on Robinson St. that they couldn't turn it down."

L.V. Knowlton, assistant to Clarenceville superintendent of schools, reported on cost factors at the hearing.

An original estimate, obtained on March 4, set costs at \$36,500, but as of May 22, the price for the paving went up \$9,000. Cost per foot went from \$3.25 to \$4.24.

As things stand now, the Westbrook neighborhood should be paved by November, according to Hall.
