BDIANAPOLIS — The moving industry's first computer-controlled van management system has been inaugurated. Aero Mayflower Transit Company announced that instanaeous elecommunications now link the long-distance moving company's dispatching coffices in Los Angeles, New York City and Indianapolis with a powerful 18 M System /Seo Tecon's, stores and feeds dispatching information required to coordinate the interstate movements of a fleet of 1,500 moving vans.

Move orders, routes, sche-duling and operational informa-tion also are added to the com-puter's files. This data, stored on magnetic disks, is available for updating and to answer in-
