Court Of Appeals Hopefuls Air Views

JUDGE FOR MICHIGAN COURT OF APPEALS. District includes Oakland County along with the counties of Huron, Tuscola, Sanilac, Shiawassee, Genesee, Ingham, Lapeer, St. Clair, Livingston, Macomb, Jackson, Washtenaw, Hillsdale, Lenawee and Monroe. Nonpartisan ballot. Vote for one.

Questions asked the candidates were:
1. What background experience do you feel qualifies you for election to the bench?
2. What is your interpretation of the court's role in the over-all law enforcement structure?

S. JEROME BRONSON, 38, of Oak Park, currently Oakland County prosecutor. Attended University of Michigan and Wayne State University, Graduate of Wayne State University Law School. Memberships: National District Attorney's Association; National Council on Crime and Delinquency; American Bar Association; Michigan Prosecuting Attorney's Association and the State Bar of Michigan.

1. My 10 years experience as a practicing attorney, plus direct responsibility as prosecuting attorney for 20,000 criminal cases, during four years serving as chief law enforcement officer of Oakland County, uniquely qualifies me for the Court of Appeals.

2. I seek nomination to the State Court of Appeals, believing that my experience as prosecutor of Oakland County, should be brought to the Appeals Court. The responsibility presented to assist in fair and firm administration of justice, especially criminal justice, when crime continues to increase, is one which I seek based upon my broad experience in the law, and as chief law enforcement officer of Oakland County.

ROBERT J. DANHOFF, 42, of East Lansing, currently legal advisor to Gov. Romney, Graduate of Hope College and the University of Michigan Law School. Served as delegate to the Michigan Constitutional Convention and was chairman of the Judiciary Committee. Memberships: State Bar of Michigan, American Bar Association, Eastminster Presbyterian Church.

1. I feel that the experience I have had in both trial courts and also as legal advisor to Gov. Romney gives me the experience necessary to serve on the Appeals Court. I have been an assistant U.S. Attorney and U.S. attorney, which I feel has given me the insight and the perspective in the law enforcement field.

In addition, being a delegate to the Constitutional Convention and chairman of the Judiciary Committee, together with being an integral part of the state administration for the past five and one half years, have placed me in a unique position to interpret the state constitution and the statutes of this state.

2. Basically I feel that the court must be the impartial arbitrator between society and those accused of criminal activities. Courts is a system of laws and not of men, and it must be the function of the court to see that the laws as passed by the Legislature are fairly and adequately enforced and interpreted.

The court obviously must be the protector of individual rights, which are the keystone of our democratic form of government; but in addition, it must see that the rights of society are likewise protected.

JOHN F. FOLEY, 40, of Farmington, currently holds position of commissioner of the Michigan Court of Appeals. Graduate of Georgetown University (B.S.) and University of Michigan (J.D.). Was an attorney and hearing officer for the Detroit Office of the National Labor Relations Board. Currently a member of the Board of Directors of the Catholic Social Services of Oakland County.

1. My work as commissioner of the court of appeals uniquely qualifies me for election to this court. My experience of reviewing appeals from the trial courts and working with the judges of this court is unmatched.
