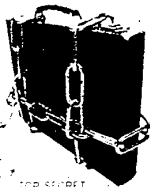

1. As an accredited newspaper correspondent and member of the legislative press corps I have kept abreast of not only the Legislature but of all state government activities. I have closely followed legislation proposed and adopted in the last 20 years. I have developed a knowledge of the legislative process and many of the individual legislators which would be a real asset if I were elected to the House of Representatives. 2. I believe that the state has substantially reformed its tax structure but not fully. Exemptions for the state income tax must at least cover the amount needed by an individual or family to maintain a minimum standard of living. A solution must be found to the problem of senior citizens and disabled veterans who are losing their property tax exemption because of increased assessments required under the new constitution.

3. A major need is in the area of legislation to permit more voluntary agreements between the city and township of Farmington and other nearby communities to solve mutual problems. Legislation is also needed to permit an orderly consolidation of the city and township if that is feasible and favored by the voters. Legislation is also needed to prevent the type of secret meetings which are currently held among township officials. Stronger control over local conflict of interest is also needed.
