

American life is lecture focus

A lecture series touching nearly every aspect of American life and ranging from pre-Revolutionary days to the present, will be offered by Oakland University as part of its biennial celebration.

The series will begin Jan. 12 with meetings every Tuesday through March 16 from 7-9 p.m. Ten lectures each will be offered at the Birmingham-Baldwin Library, Farmington Public Library, Rochester High School, Warren-Mott High School, Waterford-Mott High School and Utica-Ford High School. Participants may enroll for two hours of credit for a \$88 fee or without credit for \$28. Registrations may be made at the university or through the mail. Registrations also will be processed at the individual lecture site the first night.

THE ROCHESTER-UTICA series will lead off with a talk by Dr. Charles W. Akers, historian, on "Religion and the American Revolution."

Dr. Jane M. Bingham of the education division will follow, speaking on "Children's Books in America Before and After the Revolution."

Following in order will be: Dr. Judith K. Brown, anthropologist, "Child Rearing in Two Revolutionary Societies."

Dr. Maurice F. Brown of the English department, "Star-Spangled Nightmare: Contemporary Writers and the American Dream."

Dr. Carlo Coppola of modern languages, "The American Experience: M. N. Roy and Rabindranath Tagore, an Indian Perspective."

Dr. Mary C. Karash of the history department, "The Spanish American Revolution, 1808-1826."

Dr. Roy A. Kotynek of the history department, "Art and Revolution: The American Revolution and the Visual Arts."

Dr. Carmine R. Linsalata of modern languages, "The Sicilian Vespers: A Thrust for Freedom."

Dr. Jesse R. Pitts, sociologist, "The American Values System: The Puritan Ethos Under Attack," and Dr. Paul Tomboulis, chemist, "Two Hundred Years of Progress or The Future Is Not What It Used To Be."

THE BIRMINGHAM-WARREN series will be led off by Dr. Sheldon L. Appleton of the political science department speaking on "Democracy in the United States: Past, Present and Future."

"Futuristics: The Second Two Hundred Years of America," with Dr. Leo V. Gerulatis, historian, and Dr. Robert L. Stern, chemist.

"The Public and Crime—1776, 1876, 1976," with Dr. Allen K. Hess, psychologist, and Linde Waller-Grenard, graduate student.

"Science as a Shaping Force in the United States: Then and Now," with Dr. Abraham R. Liboff of the physics department.

"Getting Together: American Community in 1776, 1876," with Dr. Jacqueline R. Scherer of the sociology department.

"Archaeology: What It Has to Say About Our Past," with Dr. Richard B. Stamps, anthropologist, and "Becoming One Nation: The Constitutional Problems of Nationalizing Civil Liberties," with Dr. Carl R. Varn of the political science department.
