Sexism is topic of U-M conference

Sexism in school textbooks, athletics, counseling and classroom practices will be among the issues to be discussed during a conference Tuesday and Wednesday, Jan. 13-14 in The University of Michigan Chrysler Center.

Some 175 area teachers, administrators and community leaders will take part in the meeting, sponsored by the U-M Program for Educational Opportunity (PEO).

The conference theme, "Forms and Effects of Sexism in Education and a Plan for Change," will be discussed at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday by keynote speaker Barbara Sussman, former superintendent of schools in Washington.

Charles Vergon of PEO and Linda Cornelius of the U.S. Office of Civil Rights will present "Legal Update—Title IX" at 7 p.m. Tuesday.

Wednesday's format will be a series of concurrent workshops on sexism in such areas as curriculum, testing, physical education, and classroom activities.

"The conference is designed to address the specific obligations of all school districts under Title IX," said PEO Director Charles D. Moody. Enacted last July, Title IX prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in all public school systems receiving federal financial aid.

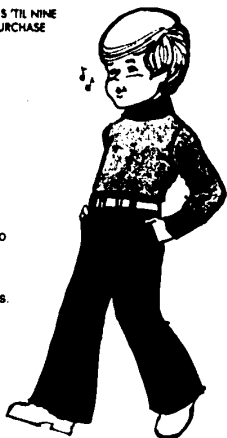
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
