Falcon matman captures crown

For the fifth straight year, Wayne Memorial matmen have captured top honors from among 31 schools at the Schoolcraft High School Wrestling Invitational, setting a record team high of 173½ points.

Seven of the Wolfpack made it to the finals. Doug Cunningham and Kevin Rize took firsts and Andy MacEachern, Dan Gamble, Randy Pittman, Tim Clark, and Rick Pittman all came in second.

The Wolfpack was also awarded the trophy for the most team falls.

After the presentation of the awards

Coach Don Haney said, "I'm real pleased. I didn't think we were quite that strong. I hope we haven't peaked too soon; we have a long way to go."

Wayne Memorial leads the state in ratings, topping Hazel Park and Temperance Bedford.

The champion heavyweight, Tim Prints of the Southfield Lathrup Chargers, with four falls in eight minutes took home the individual wrestler trophy for the wrestler with the most falls in the best time.

Four other teams had totals of over 100 team points.

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that at the Special Election to be held in Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, Michigan, on Monday, January 19, 1976, the following proposition will be submitted to vote of the qualified electors of said School District:

PROPOSITION FOR RENEWAL AND CONTINUATION OF OPERATING MILLAGE INCREASE

As a renewal and continuation of certain operating millage increases heretofore approved by the electorate, which increases expired with the 1975 levy, shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be levied against all taxable real and tangible personal property in Clarenceville School District of Oakland and Wayne Counties, be increased, as provided by Section 6, Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Michigan by \$1.00 per one thousand dollars of the assessed valuation, as finally equalized, of all such property in said School District for a period of ten (10) years, from 1976 to 1986, both inclusive, to be used only for the purpose of paying general operating expenses of said School District?

Each person voting on the foregoing proposition must be a citizen of the United States above the age of eighteen (18) years and a registered voter of the School District.

The polls of election will be open from 7:00 A.M. in the morning until 8:00 P.M. in the evening, Local Time.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the voting places for said election will be as follows:

- Precinct 1: Clarenceville Junior High School, 30116 Middlebelt Road, Livonia, Michigan.
- Precinct 2: Clarenceville Senior High School, 20115 Middlebelt Road, Livonia, Michigan.

Only registered voters are eligible to vote.

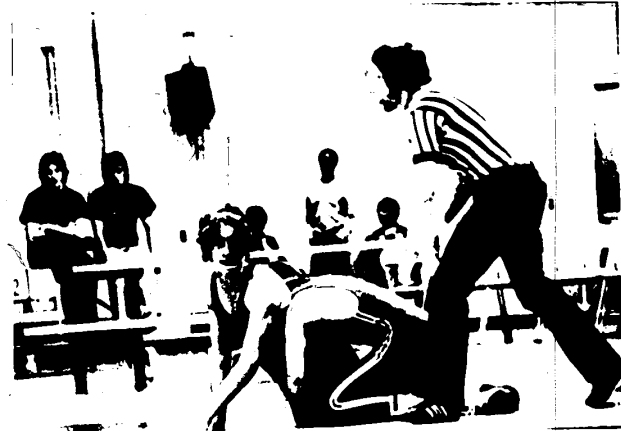
