

Blue Jay pucksters stop Livonia Churchill

Southfield High's hockey team is 1-4 after last week's efforts—a 5-3 victory over Livonia Churchill, and a 4-2 loss to Livonia Stevenson.

Against Churchill, Southfield's Dennis French scored an unassisted goal at 8:08 of the third period to break a three-all tie. Southfield was short-handed at the time with John Bruder sitting out an interference penalty.

Southfield's John McCracken added an insurance goal at the 13:47 mark. Dan Chapman and Terry Fisher had assists on the play.

Churchill won the shot war, 41-39, but Southfield outshot the Chargers, 21-13, in the crucial third period.

"A hard-checking game and some good shooting—that was our game plan," said Southfield coach Art Ca-

trini. "We tried to concentrate on shooting. We fell into a lapse in the second period, but we outshot them in the first and third."

Southfield grabbed a 2-1 lead after the opening period, thanks to goals by Joe Bonadeo and Chapman. Churchill countered with a first-period goal by Joe Bardevel and a second-period tally by John Malot.

Jim McKenzie scored for Southfield early in the third period, but Churchill tied it with a goal by Mike Fox about a minute later.

Livonia Stevenson's Frank Finn continued his productive play against Southfield. Finn, who leads the Suburban Hockey League with 21 goals in seven games, scored one goal and added an assist.

Southfield's John McCracken scored

an unassisted goal at 10:20 of the second period, and French tallied from Bonadeo and Mark Fallows at 13:32 of the third period.

Southfield goalie Don Morgan faced 23 Stevenson shots. Morgan's teammates responded with 19 shots.

Bulldogs win financial battle

The Bulldog Aquatic Club, made up of swimmers from Livonia, Westland, Garden City, Plymouth, Farmington Hills, West Bloomfield and other suburbs, found out recently that it "won" an early financial victory in an upcoming meet at Scholcraft College.

A club spokesman said that the cost of awards, pool rental, meet programs and other expenses for the group's 12th annual age group and open Class A meet have been taken care of by the Mack Trucks, Inc., and Kelsey-Hayes Co.

The meet will be Jan 30-31 and Feb. 1.

ly drain the meager treasury of a typical Amateur Athletic Union club like the Bulldogs.

The meet is open to the public and the 1975 competition attracted more than 3,000 swimmers from this country and Canada.

Mack Trucks also donated \$1,600 last year to pay for individual awards which were in the form of cast medals with chains similar to the Olympic medals.

This year, the spokesman said, the awards will be in the form of the company's logo—a bulldog.

A sample plaque with a chrom-plated bulldog design, also used on all Mack trucks, was designed and approved by the company.

The firm said it will pay for the 636

bulldog plaques but the club had to come up with the 636 9-1/4-by-4-inch wooden plaques on which to mount the trophies.

A Kelsey-Hayes division in Rockford, Ill., offered to donate 348 unissued plaques—to be given to all first through sixth place finishers at the meet.

Junior Achievement company sponsored by Kelsey-Hayes was contacted and it agreed to furnish the other 288 plaques at a small cost.

Principal workers besides Don Schoenle and his son, Don, were Ivan Forsythe of Plymouth and Jerry Mandertfield and his son, Brian, of Farmington Hills.

To raise more funds for the club, members will be selling custom tee-shirts along with swimming patches and small bulldog pins at the meet.

WB Buffalos fare well in AAU meet

Suzy Green and Mark Shagena each placed in five events in the eight-year-old-and-under category for the West Bloomfield Community AAU Swimming Club in an AAU B meet Jan. 10 and 11.

Shagena captured three first places, in the 50-yard freestyle with a 33.5, the 25-yard backstroke in 18.7 and in the 25 freestyle in 15.3. He added a third in the 25-yard breaststroke and a fourth in the 25 butterfly.

Green's 35.2 second time in the 50 freestyle gave her first place in the girls' eight and under bracket. She finished second in the 25-yard backstroke and the 25-yard freestyle, added a third in the 25 butterfly, and a fifth in the 25-yard breaststroke.

The Water Buffalos had two other winners in the same category. Lynda Hughes in the 25-yard freestyle with a time of 15.7 and Susie Lindstrom with a 20.0 second time in the 25-yard backstroke. Hughes also took second in the 50 freestyle and Lindstrom added a sixth place finish in the 50-yard freestyle.

Debbie Galbraith finished second in the 100-yard backstroke and third in the 50-yard backstroke in the girls' 10 and under bracket.

In the boys' 10 and under, Chris Payne took a fifth place in the 100-yard breaststroke and in the boys' 11 and 12 groupings. Marc Butwell finished sixth in the 50 backstroke.

In the girls' 11 and 12-year-old category Dorothy Botwell finished third in the 50-yard butterfly, Judy Sheridan took fourth in the 50-yard backstroke event and, in the 100-yard breaststroke, Mary Shuey captured second.

Freestylist Leslie Schipper swam the 300-yard freestyle event in 8:27.1, good for first place in the girls' 13 and 14 groupings. Schipper also finished fifth in the open 50-yard freestyle.

The Water Buffalos finished up the meet by taking fourth place in the open 400-yard freestyle relay with the team of D. Butwell, C. Ruwart, K. Schipper and L. Liu.
