

### Clarenceville seeks millage renewal

Clarenceville School District voters in Livonia. Farmington Hills and Red-ford Township will go to the polis next Monday, Jan. 19, to decide the renew. The school board and administration mailed newsletters to residents last week saying that the failure of voters to renew the tax. "would be disastrous to the education programs for the children of this district." If approved, the levy would be continued for another 10 years. The administration streamed that the Monday proposal is only a continuation of existing taxes and not an increase in rate. Clarenceville voters have regularly supported financial issues. The last time a money issue was defeated was in 18G and then the margin was by fewer (tan. 25 votes.

THE LEVY represents \$1 million in revenues, or about 29 per cent of the district; \$4 7 million operating budget for the current year.

The administration stressed that the school board in past years has usually levide less than the maximum millage rate allowed by voters.

The current tax rate is \$39 mills, or \$35.90 per \$1.000 of state equalized valuation.

There are an estimated \$.000 registered voters in the district. Supt. David McDowell said sweek that the device of Monday's millage issue would rereate another related money problem. The state has promised to pay 105 per cent of the 1976-77 school years also also formula to help make up for other state money cuts.

A REQUIREMENT for getting the full state payment is levying at least the same millage next year as this year.

the same numery of the state and formula is based in part on districts levying 22 mills or more If Monday's proposal is rejected. Clarenceville would be under that minimum and would penalized through lower state and payments.
