## CHRISTOPHER MILLER

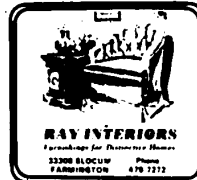

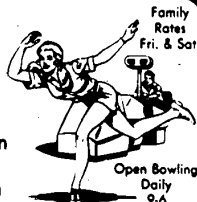

The proceeds from the rodeo are

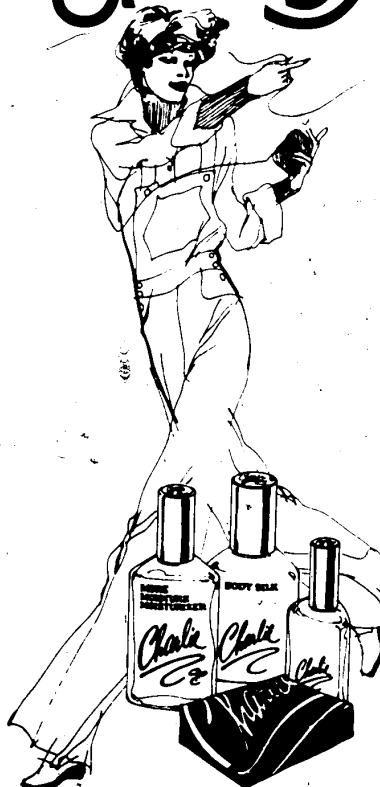
channeled back into the community.

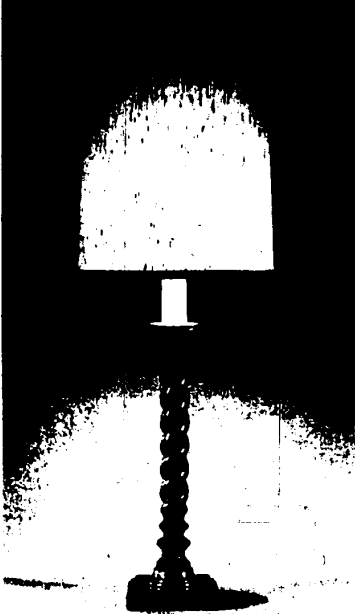

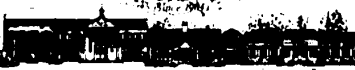
