Ted Mack, host of the "Original Amateur Hour" for 35 years, is guest speaker at the Southfield Series, at noon, Thursday, Jan. 22, at the

Raleigh House, Telegraph Road, Southfield.

Thousands of young people have appeared on the "Original Amateur Hour," the only real talent showcase for young talent. However, Mack's appearances have not been confined to the Amateur Hour alone.

Through countless performances he has given in behalf of all types of charitable institutions throughout the United States, he has become one of the most honored, respected and best known men in the entertainment world. His program for Constitution Hall in Washington D.C. some 30 years ago in behalf of the U.S.O., which featured top government officials as amateurs, is still remembered as one of the fundraising and entertainment highlights of this century.

Mack's interest in youth does not stop within the glamorous limelight of showbusiness. He has long been on the board of trustees of the "American Humanities Foundation," an organization which finances young men and women through college to become youth leaders.

"Mr. Opportunity," as Ted Mack is commonly called, established the Foundation for Young Americans, which provides scholarship grants for

youngsters, and at one time he devoted much of his time to his children's camp at Great Barrington, Mass.

The Southfield Series was founded in 1968 to establish a strong cultural program for the citizens of Southfield and its adjacent communities.

B&E suspects' case goes to circuit court

Two men charged with attempted breaking and entering and possession of a concealed weapon were bound over to Oakland County Circuit Court Friday, Jan. 18, after waiving a preliminary hearing in District Court.

Raymond E. LaLonde, 22, of Florida, and Kenneth L. Hall, 21, of Georgia, were arraigned Jan. 7 before District Court Judge Michael Hand. At that time, bond was set at \$5,000 each. Both suspects remain in Oakland County Jail and a court date has not yet been scheduled.

According to Farmington Public Safety Director Daniel Byrnes, the men were arrested Jan. 6. Hall also is wanted in Georgia on a rape charge and LaLonde in Florida for probation violation.

Officer Greg Wilson was on patrol Jan. 6 when he saw a car parked in a residential area where cars normally do not park. As the officer approached the vehicle, he noticed the car had Florida license plates. So Wilson stopped to question the two men, Byrnes said.

When Wilson asked why they were parked there, they said they were tired from their trip and had pulled over to rest. The officer then asked to see their licenses and vehicle registration.

When the glove box was opened, a tear gas canister fell out. Wilson then arrested them for possession of a concealed weapon. A .38 caliber revolver also was found in their possession.

During the time Wilson was questioning the suspects, another officer was on routine patrol and discovered an apparent burglary at the Hanna Architect Building on Grand River, one block away.

Officers were unable to make any connection between the two incidents that night.
