

YW courses fight the winter 'lags'

The Northwest YWCA, 2500 Grand River, is offering a class on antiques, another for those contemplating retirement and help for all puzzled by income tax forms.

In addition, there is an annual meeting set for Friday, Jan. 30 at noon.

The antiques class will be held on three Tuesday evenings from 7:30-9:30 p.m., starting Feb. 3. The first class will be on glass, collectable and old Ray Balm of Wyandotte, will also talk about sterling silver and jewelry.

The first class will cover Social Security; the second and third, wills and trusts and information needed at the time of a funeral. The fourth session will be on health and physical well-being and the fifth will cover housing, part-time employment, hobbies and volunteering.

Registration at \$5 for a single or \$8.50 a couple, are now being taken. YW membership is necessary.

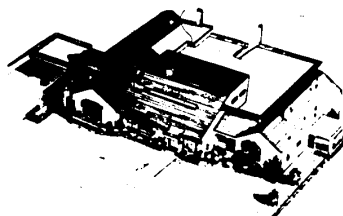
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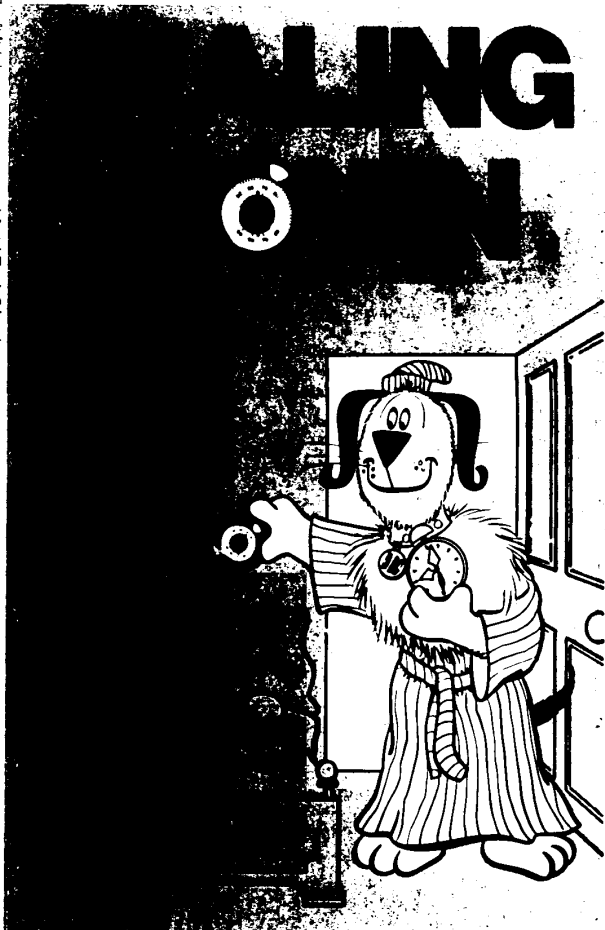
