Heart of Gold winners to be feted

Outstanding women volunteers in the tri-county area will be honored for outstanding community service at the ninth annual Heart of Gold award luncheon Feb. 19 in Cobo Hall.

Co-sponsored by the Heart of Gold Award Council and Women for the United Foundation (WUF), the 11:45 a.m. luncheon is open to the public.

Guest speaker will be actress Karen Grassle, who plays Caroline Ingalls on the NBC-TV series, "Little House on the Prairie."

About 2,000 metropolitan area residents are expected to attend the recognition luncheon. Tickets are \$7.25 and may be purchased by calling WUF, 1528 Woodward, before Jan. 27.

SOME 130 nominations for Heart of Gold awards were submitted last November by community agencies, groups and individuals throughout the Detroit area. Award council members, who represent 45 leading women's organizations, then narrowed

the field to 30 semifinalists.

Six community leaders are serving as judges to select the finalists. They are Thomas F. Morrow, retired Chrysler Corp. vice president; Dr. Julien Priver, executive vice president, Stasi Hospital; Otis M. Smith, vice president and associate general counsel, General Motors Corp.

Also, Arthur F. F. Snyder, president, Bank of the Commonwealth; Mrs. G. Metten Williams; and Mrs. R. Jamison Williams, past president of Women for the United Foundation.

HEART OF GOLD winners will receive the traditional gold heart-shaped charm symbolizing extraordinary community service during the past year.

Chairman of the Heart of Gold award council is Mrs. R. Alexander Wingley, a past WUF president. Vice-chairman is WUF board member Mrs. Ray W. Macdonald.

It also provides an opportunity for beginning art buyers to start collecting modestly priced original art works and for the seasoned buyer to enlarge his collection.

With emphasis on a reasonable price range, the show represents a broad cross-section of racial, religious, and cultural backgrounds.
