

Hawk tankers shine in OU meet

Birmingham Groves won the Class A state swimming title last season, and Coach John Webb's tankers showed they have the talent to win another state title by topping the Oakland County swimming and diving championships at Oakland University last weekend.

Groves won four events and compiled 296 team points to top the 23-school meet. Runner-up Rochester Adams scored 188 points. Bloomfield Hills Andover had 182. Royal Oak Kimball 83. Birmingham Seaholm 80. Farmington Harrison 82, and Southfield-Lathrup 71.

Some of the best swimming schools in the state are located in Oakland County, and the prep swimmers

smashed records in nine of the meet's 11 events.

"With all the swimming talent in Oakland County, this meet is kind of like a small state championship," said Harrison coach Mark Holdridge, who served as the meet director. "It really takes something to get in the top six in this meet."

This is only the third year for this meet, and I think that's the reason for all those records. They aren't well-established records. But the times this year will put them down there where they'll be hard to break in the future."

Groves' Tim Quill, a senior, broke records in the 200-yard individual medley (2:01.41) and the 100-yard back-

stroke (1:55.50). His time in the back was the fastest in the state so far.

LATHRUP'S DAVE Smith helped his team finish seventh. Smith finished second in the 100 butterfly with a :55.85 clocking, and then swam on Lathrup's 200 Medley relay, which finished second in 1:46.86.

Lathrup's Jim Barnhouse finished sixth in the diving event, scoring 310.55 points.

Holdridge's Harrison team showed some depth in finishing sixth. The Hawks' best showing came in the 400 freestyle relay where Dave Humphries, Charlie Hornack, Jim [unclear] and Jeff Arnold took fourth place in 3:28.54.

Harrison's 200 medley relay [unclear] Emerson, Chris Hoehner, Humphries and Hornack finished fifth in 1:48.50. Hoehner was fifth in the 200 IM (2:11.22). Humphries took fifth in the 100 butterfly (1:57.81), and Emerson finished fifth in the 100 backstroke (1:52.17).

Southfield High, which finished 10th with 16 team points, got a good performance from senior Steve Kushner, who took fourth in the 50 freestyle with a 23.13 time.

North Farmington finished 16th with nine points. Raider Keith Dwyer finished 10th in the 100 backstroke. Farmington High qualified swimmers for the meet, but failed to score any points.
