Raiders shock W. Bloomfield

North Farmington jumped off to a quick lead, but West Bloomfield battled back and fought the Raiders point for point. Only when the Lakers missed on a last second shot did

North Farmington clinch a 60-58 win on Friday.

North Farmington was stalling in the last half-minute of the game when West Bloomfield elected to go with a pressure defense hoping to steal the ball. The tactic worked as James Risk intercepted a pass near mid-court with eight seconds left and dove in for a lay-up between two Raider defenders.

Risk's shot rolled off the rim but teammate Don Sasa slapped the ball into the basket as time expired bringing a roar from the West Bloomfield crowd. But Sasa's apparent score was disallowed by the referee and the victory went to North Farmington.

Sasa's apparent score was disallowed because he had slipped it in. A player must have control of the ball when he takes a shot if the game is in the final minute. Slapping a ball for a score in the final minute is not allowed.

North Farmington started last by taking advantage of West Bloomfield errors to forge a 10-1 lead midway through the first period.

But the Raiders got their fast break untracked and ran off seven straight baskets to close the lead to 14-8. From then on the teams viciously traded basket for basket until the Raiders ran off six unanswered points late in the second period to take a 27-24 lead at half-time.

The Lakers quickly tied the game up in the third period when Hillel Masel scored on a three-point play. But North Farmington clung to a small lead throughout most of the quarter as they beat West Bloomfield's press with cross court passes for easy baskets from underneath the hoop. Mike Morrow and John Palek, who were at the receiving end of those passes, scored 12 of their team's 16 points in that period.

North Farmington had a six-point lead, 56-50, with 2:39 remaining. With

time becoming a factor, West Bloomfield began giving the ball to Brian Clifford their star forward. He forced three fouls in a row and scored on a lay-up to bring the Lakers to within one point, 57-56, and set up the dramatic ending.

Clifford scored 15 points, eight in the last period, to tie for game high honors with North Farmington's Mike Garcia also with 15. Each team had balanced scoring with the Lakers' Sasa and Risk with 12 and 10 respectively and Kevin Kowalski with 13. In double figures for the Raiders were Dan Werner with 12 and Morrow and Matt Kurajian with 10 apiece.

"We had no game plan," admitted Raider Coach Ken Dean. "We just fell into the defense we used most of the night—it's a modification of our normal zone and it did a good job because they didn't get inside."

"They went into the press and that gave us some easy shots," he added. "We got good play out of everyone tonight. It felt dirty near the end of the game because it was hot near the bench but the win feels great. It feels just great." "They earned it," said Laker Coach Tim Domke. "We just

waited too late to start playing then we played like we used to—hungry and aggressive."

Harrison wins; Preston's spree dooms Falcons

Farmington Harrison 9-opped Waterford Mett, 55-51, in a Western Six League basketball game last Friday.

In another game, John Preston scored 45 points to lead Waterford Township past Farmington High, 69-66, in the Inter Lakes League.

Harrison had balanced scoring led by Mike Styles' 12 points in winning his seventh game against five losses. The Hawks are 4-1 in the WSL. Harrison jumped to a 14-4 lead after one quarter and then extended the margin to 13 points (23-10) at half-time.

Coch Rob Sutter's Harrison team shot well (49 percent) from the floor, and guarded even better from the free throw line (61 percent). Mett won the rebounding battle, 47-23.

Preston, a 6-8 center, made 20 field goals and five of six free throws. He also grabbed 14 rebounds, but Farmington outscored the Clippers, 43-37.

Randy Meyer scored 15 points on six buckets and three of four free throws to lead Farmington. Falcon center Brian Stenloff scored 13 points and pulled down 15 rebounds. Rick Milburn scored 12 points and had eight assists.
