Six persons, including persons from Livonia, Farmington Hills and Westland, were injured in a three-car collision Monday night on Merriman, south of Eight Mile, in Livonia. Livonia officers ticketed Michael Kean, 17, of 19650 Deering, Livonia, with driving too fast for conditions. The police reported that Kean's auto was southbound on Merriman and the driver lost control, crossed the center line and moved into the path of a northbound car driven by James Gow, 44, of 6804 Merriman, Westland. The impact resulted in the Kean car spinning and striking another auto, driven by Gary Tur, 27, of 28538 Gornada, Farmington. Gow's passenger, Gerry Wheland, 26, of 38803 Bedford, Farmington Hills, and Tur's passenger, Carol Ann Alspaugh, 22, of Northville. Gow and Wheland were treated by their own doctors while the others were treated at Botsford Hospital, Farmington. It was snowing at the time of the collision and the roads were slippery, officers said.
