## David Phreaner will meet Farmington congregation

Candidating Week starts Sunday, Feb. 15, for Farmington's Universalist Unitarian Church congregation which will meet ministerial candidate Dr. David Phreaner and his wife, Kathleen O'Neil.

The congregation has been without a minister since the Rev. Rex Neff left the church, 25301 Haledale Road in July 1973. Dr. Phreaner will be the first minister in said to meet the congregation since that time.

Interim church services and church activities have been handled by the church board members and church committees.

He will deliver the service on the first Sunday morning of his visit. He will be hosted with a round of neighborhood pot luck dinners given by members of the congregation.

DR. PHREANER graduated from Amherst College in 1969, with honors and a degree in psychology. He obtained his masters degree from University of Chicago Divinity School and his doctorate of ministry from Meadville Lombard Theological School, also with honors. His theses written on "Syncretistic Ministry: A Model of Ministry Based on the Psychology of Erik Erikson, Eric Berne and Fritz Perls."

Chuck Gallagher, president of the church board, said that the public committee made its selection of a new minister by distributing a questionnaire to the

congregation at large, asking each member what was important to the individual in a ministerial candidate.
